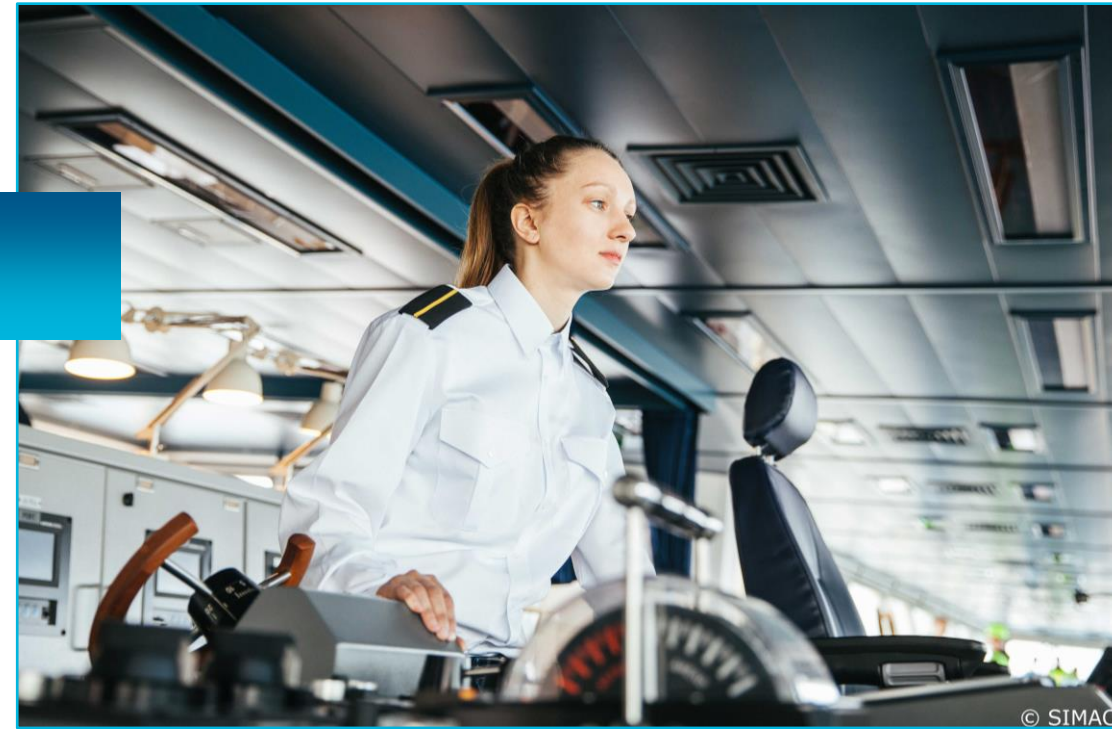

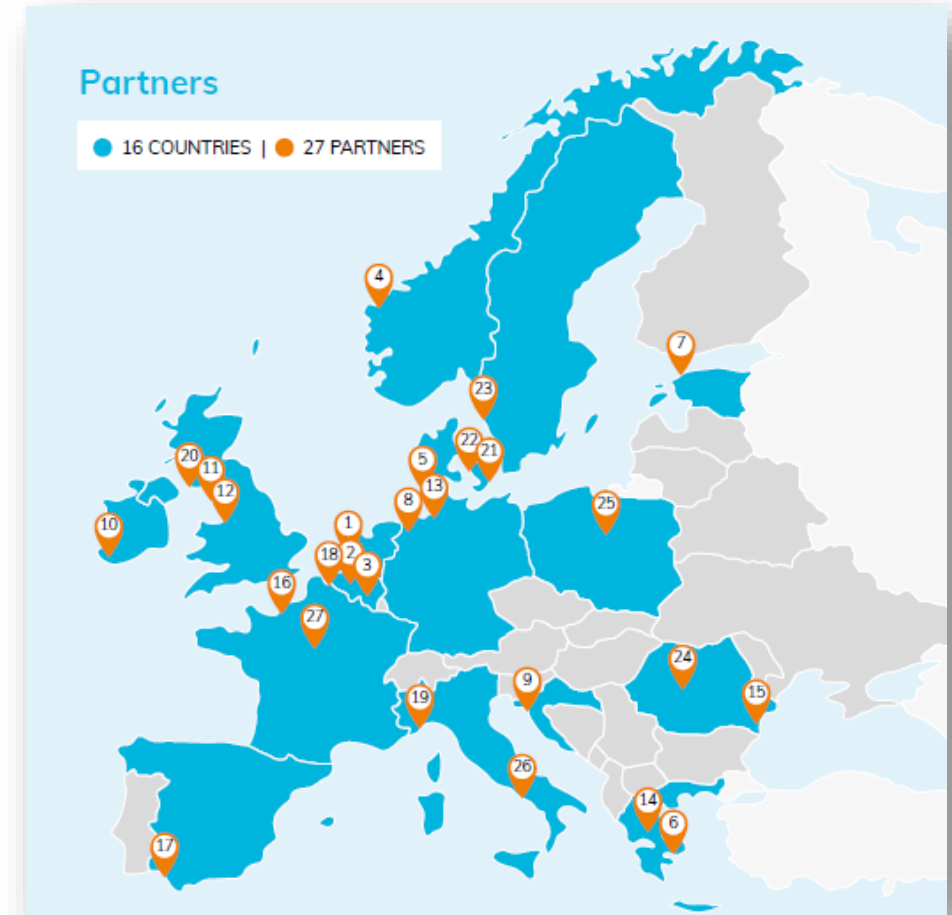

SkillSea: 4-year project launched with the aim of supporting maritime professionals in obtaining key digital, green and soft management skills for the rapidly-changing maritime labour market.





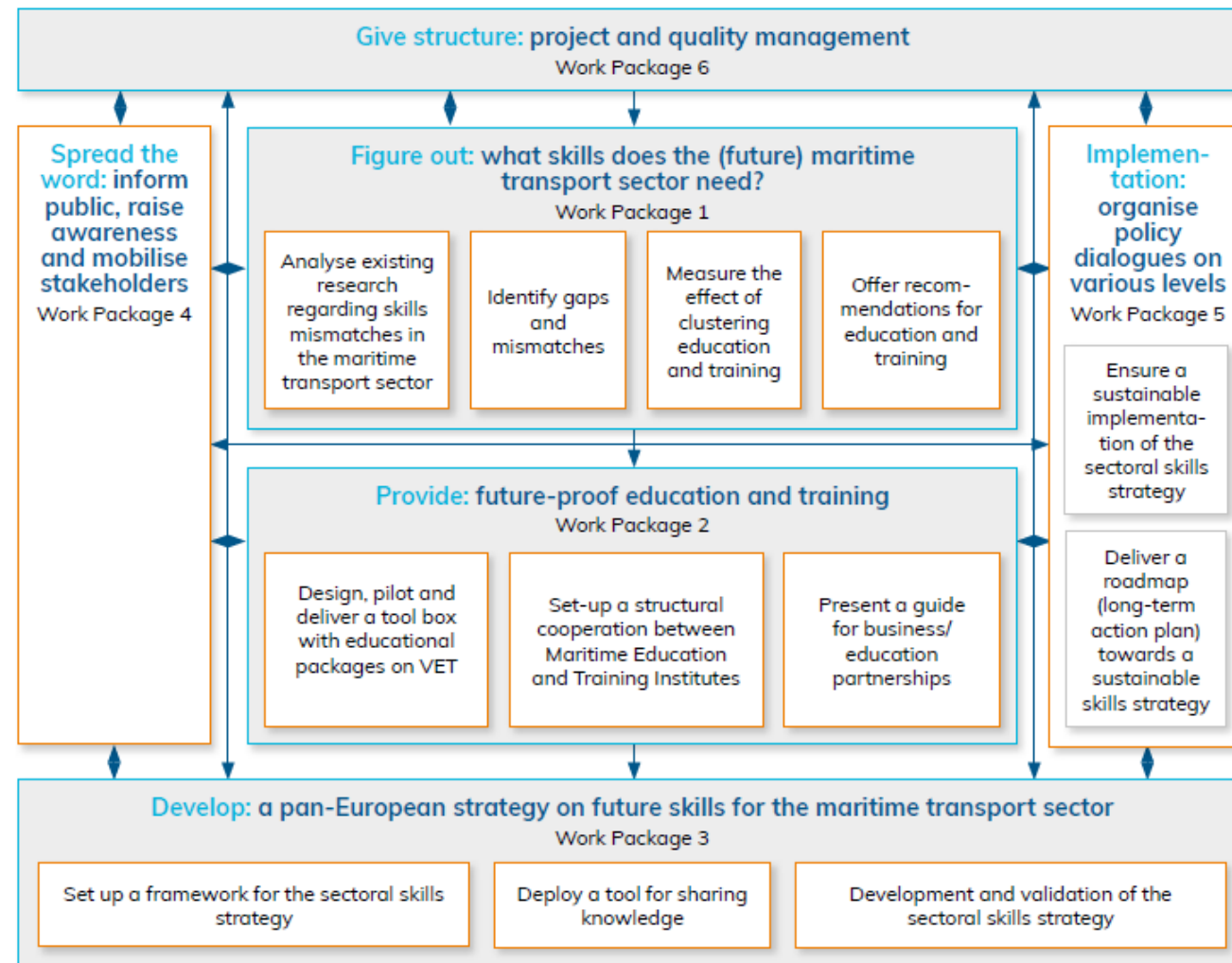
Core objective of the project
